DAY 1~SUNDAY~OCTOBER 8 LOS ANGELES/DALLAS/QUITO

Your journey begins as you board yourAmerican Airlines flight. Upon arrival in the evening, you will be escorted to your elegant hotel which is located in the heart of historic "Quito Antigo" and surrounded by churches, museums and national monuments. An official National Treasure, Patio Andaluz holds centuries of history within its walls and is a marvelous building of Colonial origin, which offers every visitor an experience not unlike turning back in time. It was part of the original Solaris (original building sites) that constituted the City of San Francisco of Quito at the time it was founded. Enjoy the enchantment and comfort that this elegant boutique hotel offers, with large arches, balconies, and towering attics that gives the feeling of being in the republican era. The inviting guestrooms have hard wood floors, vaulted ceilings, original works of art



and fresh picked flowers and feature colonial style headboards, armoires, Latin work desks with antique lamps, color televisions and large windows. Hotel amenities include a coffee shop, full gourmet restaurant, a Tapas wine bar, spa, gym and solarium.

DAY 2~MONDAY~OCTOBER 9

QUITO~COLONIAL CITY

Your morning is at leisure. This afternoon embark on a tour of Quito's colonial quarter, the largest and best preserved of South America. With over 400 years of history and a strong Spanish heritage, you will see sublime colonial flavor in the architectural masterpieces such as private buildings and mansions, the cloisters and churches, museums and public buildings. The stroll starts at the Independence Plaza, flanked by the Cathedral, the Presidential Palace, the Municipal Palace and the Archbishop's Palace. Visit the temple of *La Compaňia de Jesús* and its awesome gilded interior. Continue on to the Monastery of San Francisco, one of the great religious buildings of the New World, with its impressive façade and atrium that lead to its Baroque interior influenced by Moorish style, with the winged Virgin of Quito at its main altar. Visit Academia Latinoamericana before you return to your hotel where the rest of the day is at leisure to further explore the city and shop.

DAY 3~TUESDAY~OCTOBER 10 QUITO/OTAVALO

Early this morning you will depart for South America's most famous Indian fair, the Otavalo Market, centered around 'Poncho Plaza'. The best day of the week to hit this famous and friendly corner of the Andes is Saturday – the biggest

market day for visitors and locals alike, but a mini market is offered daily. All day long, the sounds of Andean pipe music, and Quechua, the native tongue derived from the Incan language, drift across the square. As you stroll the streets you'll find everything from sweaters to wall hangings to ceramic fried eggs, fresh produce to intricate jewelry. "Market Day" has been an essential part of the Ecuadorian life for centuries. The Indian's economic life relies very heavily on this tradition, and this is where they can exchange gossip and learn of important events.



After your visit to the Otavalo Market you

will enjoy an authentic Andean lunch at a local restaurant, followed by a stopover in Cotacachi – the center of Ecuador's leather industry and the best place to purchase inexpensive leather goods. You will return to Quito late in the afternoon, where the remainder of the evening is at your leisure.

DAY 4~WEDNESDAY~OCTOBER 11

QUITO/GALAPAGOS ISLANDS: SAN CRISTOBAL ISLAND~CERRO COLORADO

In the morning you will be escorted at the airport for your flight to the Galapagos Islands, where you will meet up by your naturalist guide and take a short bus ride to the pier to board the vessel, the M/Y Coral II. On land and in the sea, the Galapagos Islands give the impression of a diabolic Garden of Eden. The islands' tumultuous volcanic history of scorched earth and fiery flows are evident the moment you arrive. Inhospitable. Uninhabitable. Tortured. These are the

adjectives inspired by the lava-seascape. But look closer... this seemingly Spartan landscape is in fact teeming with life - the first of the Galapagos' many contradictions. Suddenly you realize that what you thought was a rock is in fact a sun-seeking iguana! And to add to your surprise, it doesn't seem the least bit perturbed by your intrusive gaze ... another Galapagos contradiction. Due to their long history of isolation from humans, both land and sea animals remain virtually fearless and unaffected by visitors. This is the land that Charles Darwin visited as a naturalist on board the HMS Beagle, which was bound on a long scientific survey expedition to South America and the South Seas (1831-36). His zoological and geological discoveries on the voyage resulted in numerous important publications, and formed the basis of his theories on evolution.



For the next five days, you will bear witness to our planet's most captivating wildlife; for example, their namesake, the 600-pound tortoises, which in the Spanish language, are called Galapagos. You'll be mesmerized by the awe-inspiring landscapes and misty volcanic peaks. The underwater world is equally enchanting. The Motor Yacht Coral II is decorated with teakwood and has a modern design. Its eleven spacious cabins are decorated with a marine motif and all have private facilities. The dining room is artfully decorated and the sun decks of the yacht also provide a lot of places with shade. The outdoor deck of the Coral II is perfect for picture taking or to enjoy the sun. After the expert naturalists share their knowledge of the area, you will no longer be able to view your trip as a mere visit, but as a cherished experience.

This afternoon after the welcome briefing and safety drill, a delicious buffet lunch is served. Afterwards travel by bus to the highlands to visit Centro de Crianza Jacinto Gordillo (La Galapaguera Cerro Colorado) where the National Park has established a breeding program for the giant land tortoises that you will encounter in their natural habitat. Learn about their origin, evolution and threats by introduced animals at the information center for visitors. Along the trail, you will find the San Cristobal (Chatham) mockingbird and Calandrinia plant, both endemic to this island. Join your fellow yacht mates this evening for your first briefing followed by our Captain's welcome cocktail party and dinner prepared by our well-trained chefs.

DAY 5~THURSDAY~OCTOBER 12

GALAPAGOS ISLANDS: SAN CRISTOBAL ISLAND~CERRO BRUJO & PUNTA PITT

A dinghy ride along the shores of tuff-stone layers will bring you to Cerro Brujo's white coralline beach (*wet landing*) where you should be able to spot seabirds like Blue-footed Boobies, Nazca Boobies, herons, and some shore birds. Also, look for Galapagos sea lions. Highlights ashore include the Chatham (San Cristobal) Mockingbird, Chatham lava lizard; both species are endemic to this island and seen nowhere else in Galapagos. You may also spot Yellow Warblers, Galapagos Flycatchers, and with luck, a Vermillion Flycatcher (endemic subspecies to San Cristobal).

Disembark (*wet landing*) on the eastern tip of the island and visit Pitt Point (Punta Pitt). Here there are endemic species such as lava lizards and red-footed boobies. The view is impressive when you walk up to the high part of the island. You may be lucky to see the Red-footed Booby – the least seen of the bunch. It's also the home of the Chatham Mockingbird, only found here on San Cristobal Island.

DAY 6~FRIDAY~OCTOBER 13

GALAPAGOS ISLANDS: MOSQUERA ISLET & BARTOLOME ISLAND

After breakfast disembark at Mosquera (*wet landing*), a tiny islet between Baltra and North Seymour with a long narrow beach and large population of sea lions. Created by geological uplift, the island is flat rather than the conical shape of the volcanic islands. There is no trail on the island so after your wet landing; you will have the opportunity to enjoy the open area. Most of the islet is covered with sand and barren lava rock. Very little sesuvium portulacastrum grows on the sand. It is also an excellent site for observing shorebirds such as herons and Lava Gulls.

After lunch visit Bartolome (dry landing), a small rugged island off the

eastern shore of Santiago where it seems like you are walking on the moon. This young island is inhospitable to most plants and animals. Embark on a 30-minute climb to a summit of a once-active volcano for a panoramic view which includes the guardian point of Pinnacle Rock, the worn-away remnant of a cone composed of spewed ashy particles. This is a steep climb aided by a wooden staircase but the view from the top is worth the effort. Down below, the water is crystal clear, and you can swim and snorkel with schools of fish after your hike. On the other side, you will find sea turtles and white-tipped sharks close to the shore. You will have time to enjoy snorkeling and swimming from the beach with the endemic Galapagos penguins that frequent this cove.

DAY 7~SATURDAY~OCTOBER 14

GALAPAGOS ISLANDS: RABIDA ISLAND & CHINESE HAT

Disembark at Rabida Island (*wet landing*) on a red-colored beach, due to the unusually high content of iron in the volcanic material. A gratifying stroll along the beach of this small island allows the observation of a large colony of sea lions, marine iguanas, mockingbirds, Yellow Warblers and several species of Darwin's Finches. Very close to the beach, hidden behind a strip of green saltbush, is a salt pond where at times Greater Flamingos migrate to; these spectacular birds feed on the brine shrimp found in this saline pond. From June to November pelicans nest in the surroundings. This is a great place to snorkel from the beach, both for beginners as well as for experienced snorkelers, due to the



unique combination of underwater species and submarine landscapes. During navigation to your next destination, keep your eyes open for dolphins.

Located off the Southern tip of Santiago, Sombrero Chino or Chinese Hat owes its name to its shape. After a wet beach landing with sea lion colonies, the trail gives way to a primeval landscape of volcanic rubble including cracked lava formations and lava tubes. The lava tubes are fragile and one must be careful to stay on the trail. See marine iguanas and pairs of oystercatchers and have some superb opportunities for picture taking. Overnight aboard the M/Y CORAL I or II. (B,L,D)





DAY 8~SUNDAY~OCTOBER 15

GALAPAGOS ISLANDS: SANTA CRUZ ISLAND~HIGHLANDS/BALTRA AIRPORT

Drop anchor at Puerto Ayora (dry landing) this morning and travel by bus to Cerro Chato Reserve, one of the best places in the

archipelago to see giant tortoises in their natural habitat. The tortoises are easy to spot, lumbering around, eating grass and leaves and wallowing in the small pools that are common in the reserve. You may also spot some highland birds, like cattle egrets, mockingbirds, finches or flycatchers. There are several lava tunnels in the reserve, a great place to spot the barn owl. There is also a small lagoon covered in red algae where gallinules and Galápagos Pintails can be found. Return to Puerto Ayora and transfer to the airport for your flight to Guayaquil. Your farewell dinner will be at a local restaurant. Later this evening you will be transferred to the airport for your return flights home. (B,D)



DAY 9~MONDAY~OCTOBER 16

MIAMI/LOS ANGELES

This morning finds you in USA with incredible memories of spectacular wildlife and incredible people. Whenever you look back on this experience just know that you're in good company – the Galapagos Islands have touched the hearts and imaginations of Lord Byron, Charles Darwin and countless others like yourself.

DAY 8~SUNDAY~OCTOBER 15 SANTA CRUZ ISLAND/GUAYAQUIL/LIMA

Return to Baltra Island and transfer to the airport for your flight to Guayaquil where you bid the rest of the group returning to the USA goodbye, and prepare for your next adventure. Your flight takes you to Lima, where you will be met you will be met and escorted to your hotel, Atton San Isidro, a modern hotel located in Lima's San Isidro neighborhood, close to Parque el Olivar, Huaca Pucllana, and Parque de la Reserva. Nearby points of interest also include the National Stadium and Parque Kennedy. The 9-story building features 252 elegantly furnished guestrooms all equipped with modern amenities. The hotel has an outdoor swimming pool, sauna, jacuzzi, a restaurant offering national and international cuisine, and an elegant terrace.

Day 9~Monday~October 16 Lima

This morning, discover Lima, Peru's ancient capital, on a guided tour. Visit the cathedral and then continue to the San Francisco Monastery, an old convent founded in the 16th century. It is known for its cloister, featuring mosaic tiles from Seville, Spain, and for its catacombs, which served as Lima's cemetery through the colonial period.

Your next stop is the Larco Herrera Museum founded in 1926. The museum possesses more than 45,000 pre-Columbian pieces and provides an incomparable opportunity to discover the mysteries of the pre-Inca

world. The permanent exhibition contains

thousands of priceless objects, including gold and jewelry, ceramic statuary and sculptures, metals, textiles, and a display of erotic representations of the ancient world.

The afternoon and evening are at leisure. Your hotel is located in the heart of the traditional Miraflores district, just two blocks from Parque Kennedy and surrounded by Lima's finest dining and shopping. Peruvian cuisine is delightful and Lima has many fine restaurants. Enjoy a traditional Peruvian lunch at La Huaca Pucllana restaurant located in one of the pre-Columbian temples in this 6-hectare archaeological site. This temple was built in 400 A.D. and is located in the nearby suburb of Miraflores. As far back as 3,000 years ago this area was an important religious and administrative center of the Lima culture. Today have lunch at Restaurante La Huaca Pucllana, which is a warm and cozy restaurant with a spectacular view of the illuminated surrounding ruins.

DAY 10~TUESDAY~OCTOBER 17 LIMA/CUSCO/URUBAMBA VALLEY~ PISAC MARKET

You will begin your day with a flight to Cusco, where upon arrival you'll board a bus to Yucay, which is located in the

heart of the Urubamba Valley, the sacred valley of the Incas.

Your visit will be to the town of Pisac. A vital Inca road once snaked its way up the canyon that enters the Urubamba Valley at Pisac. The citadel, at the entrance to this gorge, now in ruins, controlled a route which connected the Inca Empire with Paucartambo, on the border of the eastern jungles. Set high above a valley floor patch worked by patterned fields and rimmed by vast terracing, the stonework and panoramas at Pisac's Inca citadel are magnificent. Terraces, water ducts and steps have been cut out of solid rock, and in the upper sector of the ruins, the main Sun Temple is equal to anything at Machu Picchu. Above the temple lie still more ruins, mostly



unexcavated, and among the higher crevices and rocky overhangs several ancient burial sites are hidden. Pisac also offers



a very colorful "Market Day" every Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday. Similar to Otavalo's market, you can purchase handcrafted jewelry, leather, beautiful woolens, ponchos, carpets, and alpaca products.

Your hotel is located on seven acres in the heart of the Sacred Valley of the Incas, just six miles from Ollantaytambo train station. The hotel is closer to Machu Picchu than Cusco City, as well as from the most important archaeological sites, such as Ollantaytambo, Pisac, Chincheros, Moray, Maras, and more. Casa Andina Hotel at Urubamba is surrounded by gardens and has 85 fully equipped guest rooms that open to balconies. Guest rooms provide complimentary wireless Internet access, direct-dial phones, and in-room safes. The

hotel has a full-service spa, steam room, sauna, and fitness facility. Overnight at CASA ANDINA PRIVATE COLLECTION URUBAMBA. (B,L)

DAY 11~WEDNESDAY~OCTOBER 18 URUBAMBA VALLEY~OLLANTAYTAMBO

Explore Ollantaytambo this morning, a major Inca fortress and one of the few places where the Spaniards lost a major battle during the conquest. Ollantaytambo is a massive citadel which served as both a temple and a fortress. The temple area is at the top of the terracing. The stone used for these buildings was quarried from the mountainside three miles away and high above the opposite bank of the Rio Urubamba – transporting the blocks from the quarry to the site was a stupendous feat, and as of yet no one has been able to establish how it was accomplished.

Your afternoon is at leisure to enjoy the fabulous facilities of your hotel or sightsee on your own. Overnight at CASA ANDINA PRIVATE COLLECTION URUBAMBA. (B,L)

DAY 12~THURSDAY~OCTOBER 19 MACHU PICCHU

Today you depart on one of South America's most scenic rail trips from Ollanta Station to the legendary "Lost City of the Incas," Machu Picchu. Your one and a half hour rail journey is filled with breathtaking sights, en route to this mountain-top sanctuary of the Incas (which was hidden from the world until 1911 when Yale archaeologist Hiram Bingham rediscovered it.) Machu Picchu straddles a high ridge, with sheer cliffs on three sides, and the Urubamba River below curves around it and fills the canyon with its roar. In all directions, there are the Andean peaks covered in jungle green, a spectacular setting for these ancient ruins. There are temples,



houses, terraces for growing crops that could be functional today, and even gardens and a sacrificial altar. No one knows what happened to this civilization and why this city mysteriously disappeared, adding to the allure and spirituality of this incredible World Heritage Site.

Once you step through the door of your home for the night, you will feel the magic of this place. The train station is only steps away, but your intimate 85-cottage hotel is a world apart. The hotel, surrounded by 12 secluded acres of exquisite beauty, combines a reverence for nature with a commitment to indulging your every whim.

Be sure to explore the orchid trail on the hotel grounds which is within a spectacular cloud forest and is considered to be a genetic bank because of its wealth of biodiversity. It is the world's largest native species orchid garden, with 372 species of native orchids. In addition, 154 bird species, 108 butterfly species, more than 200 species of trees, and a great variety of reptiles and



mammals, including two spectacled bears, have been seen. The hotel offers activities that promote contact with nature and the local culture and implements projects for researching and conserving the local flora and fauna in cooperation with prestigious international institutions. Your superior room is the perfect sanctuary for simple relaxation with luxurious bedding and an inviting dining area. Decorated with local crafts and eucalyptus beams, your room includes a room heater, a colonial style wardrobe, Andean slippers crafted from recycled materials, plus a complete set of environmentally friendly toiletries, all provided for your personal comfort.

DAY 13~FRIDAY~OCTOBER 20

MACHU PICCHU/CUSCO

You will have the morning free to return to Machu Picchu (*optional at an additional fee*) and continue exploring the city, or enjoy some of the in-house activities of Inkaterra Hotel (*optional at an additional fee*). As you will enter the citadel early, there will be wonderful opportunities to take photographs. In the afternoon, you will be returning to Cusco via rail, which takes approximately three and a half hours. Upon check-in at your hotel, the evening is at leisure.


You will be staying at the charming Aranwa Cusco Boutique hotel; a converted colonial mansion located only a short walk from Cusco's cathedral, near the airport, and 15 minutes' drive to the most-visited archaeological sites in the city including Sacsayhuamán, Quenko, Puca Pucará, and Tambomachay. The hotel's 43 rooms and suites are decorated in the traditional style of a 16th century mansion. The marble-floored bathrooms have large Jacuzzi-style baths, a Scottish shower, and heated floors to keep you warm on the cold Andean nights. All guestrooms and suites are equipped with intelligent oxygen systems that reduce the sense of altitude and prevent altitude sickness syndrome. The multicultural Mishti restaurant is serving a delicious combination of Peruvian and Andean cuisine with a modern twist. DAY 14~SATURDAY~OCTOBER 21 CUSCO

This morning you will enjoy a guided tour of Cusco. Visit the impressive colonial cathedral that contains over 400 paintings from the Cusqueña School, beautiful cedar wood carvings such as the choir and the pulpit, as well as some objects made of silver. Continue to Koricancha (Sun Temple), known today as Santo Domingo Church. During the Inca period, the stones of this temple were covered with gold.

Your city tour ends with a visit to the gigantic Inca fortress of Sacsayhuamán. The Incas told the Spaniards that they weren't the ones who built Sacsayhuamán, but "the giants" built it. In their mythology there were huge people living in the Cuzco area, and they carried the huge stone blocks and put them together. The city of



Cuzco was built in the shape of a puma, a holy animal in the Inca beliefs. The head of the puma was actually Sacsayhuamán, a massive fortress of the Incas capable of accommodating 5,000 fighters. Today the complex is in ruins, but we know from chronicles and word-of-mouth from local Quechuans that it was once bigger, higher, and had towers. Your afternoon is at leisure.

DAY 15~SUNDAY~OCTOBER 22 CUSCO/LIMA/EN ROUTE

Your flight this morning returns you to Lima where the rest of your day is at leisure. A day room is reserved to you at the Atton Hotel to relax before your evening flight back home. Later tonight, transfer to the airport for your overnight flight to Los Angeles. (B)

DAY 16~MONDAY~OCTOBER 23 LOS ANGELES

Arrive home. You have just experienced a unique world, one that combines the thrill of ancient civilizations and amazing natural history.

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT ECUADOR, THE GALAPAGOS & PERU

Mainland Ecuador

- Quito is located at an altitude of close to 9,000 feet and may present acclimatization problems for individuals. Many of the visits to volcanoes and the countryside are also at higher altitudes.
- Guayaquil is at sea level but has a high degree of humidity. To enjoy this destination to its fullest, travelers must be in good physical condition and consult with a medical professional should there be any respiratory ailments.

Galapagos

- Participants must be able to climb in and out of vehicles and boats/pangas unassisted. Bear in mind that some landings are wet, and others are dry, so you need to be able to get in and out of the boats easily enough and proper footwear is essential.
- You should also be able to tolerate nature walks at an easy pace on uneven terrain, sometimes uphill, for three or four hours at a time in heat and humidity. The islands are volcanic and the ground in many cases is jagged and uneven. You should have good stability as falling can cause injury.


